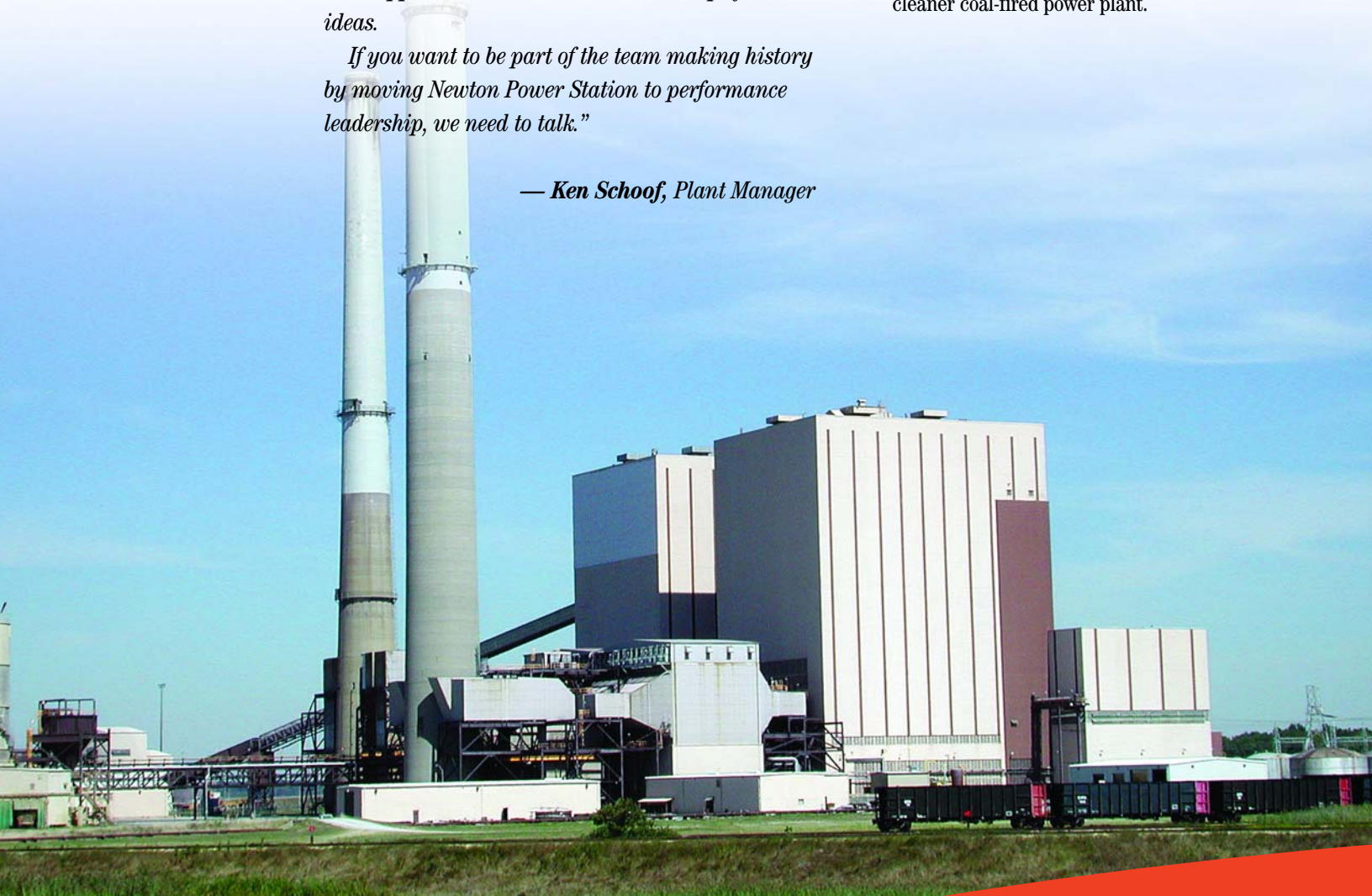

Newton has two Combustion Engineering tangentially-fired pulverized coal boilers and General Electric turbine generators. The Newton plant can generate 1142 net megawatts. Newton Unit 1 began operation in 1977, while Unit 2 began operation in 1982. Newton has more than 170 employees.

Environmental upgrades include:

- Low NOx burners
- NOx neural control systems
- Precipitator conditioning and controls

Future plans include additions of Hg control, scrubbers and Selective Catalytic Reduction systems to make Newton an even cleaner coal-fired power plant.

The Newton plant, located in Jasper County, is built next to Newton Lake, which occupies 1,770 acres and was built to supply water for the plant. The lake is managed by the Illinois Department of Natural Resources and boasts some of the best trophy bass fishing in the country.

- 60 miles from Terre Haute, IN
- 80 miles from Springfield, IL
- 120 miles from St. Louis, MO
