## ARE PHANTOM LOADS HAUNTING YOUR HOME?

Here's a frightening fact: In the average home, **75 percent of the electricity used to power home electronics is consumed while the products are turned OFF.**

Many appliances and electronic devices continue to use power even when they are turned off, creating what are called "phantom loads." In fact, more than 25 phantom loads are lurking in the average home. Common culprits are televisions, DVD players, stereos, computers, kitchen appliances and charging devices.

### Follow these simple tips to fight phantom loads:

- **Unplug** televisions, office equipment and other high-tech electronic devices if you're going to be away for an extended period of time.
- Use **power strips** for as many electronic devices as possible and turn the strip off when you are away or sleeping.
- Use **LED-powered** nightlights and remove unnecessary nightlights and other non-essential electronic equipment.
- Look for the **ENERGY STAR®** symbol when buying new appliances or electronics.

We also offer a real-time pricing option, as well as an enhanced hourly pricing program for residential customers called Power Smart Pricing.

**We encourage our customers to explore all of their supply options.** Regardless of your choice for electric supply, as your energy delivery company, we will continue to respond to service calls, outages and emergencies.

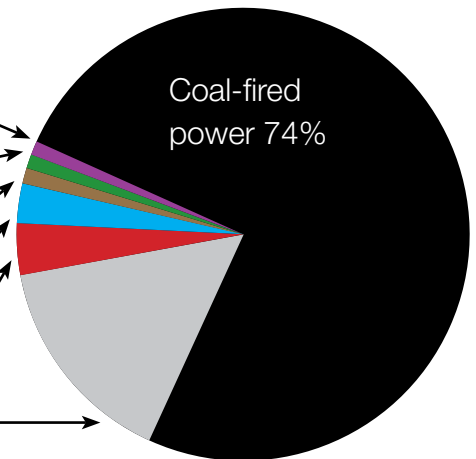
