


Pond Closure At-A-Glance

Ameren Missouri is closing all of its legacy ash ponds, the basins that store coal combustion residuals (CCRs) that are not recycled. The detailed, aggressive plan calls for an increase in recycling and long-term stewardship of the basins.

CLOSING

All of Ameren Missouri’s legacy ash ponds will be closed by 2023, with a majority finished by 2021. Several have already been closed. It’s part of our transition to cleaner forms of energy in a responsible fashion. Advanced engineering methods and technologies will enhance protection of the environment.
