ACCELERATE SAVINGS WITH AN ELECTRIC VEHICLE


In the market for a new car? Today's electric vehicles (EVs) are worth a second look — and a test drive

Flectric vehicles are fun to drive and cost less to fuel and maintain. In fact, the average EV owner saves up to \$1,300 a year on fuel alone. Plus, federal and state incentives may be available to offset the cost of purchasing an electric vehicle. EV owners can enroll in the new Ameren Illinois EV Delivery Service Rate Program. Charging at home is easy. Just enroll, charge your vehicle overnight, and save on the delivery service portion of your Ameren Illinois bill.

From SUVs to sports cars and sedans, there are many types of EVs to choose from. Some models boast a driving range of more than 300 miles.

More than 300 public charging stations are available in Illinois. Approximately sixty of those are located in Ameren Illinois service territory and more are planned. In July 2021, the Illinois Commerce Commission approved Ameren Illinois' plan to improve access to at-home and on-the-road EV charging infrastructure. By providing motorists with more charging options, our plan will help jump-start electric vehicle adoption in Illinois and accelerate progress toward meeting our state's green energy goals.

NEW MOBILE TECHNOLOGY "SNIFFS" OUT METHANE

Coming to a neighborhood near you: a new Ameren Illinois "gas sniffing" vehicle that quickly identifies the presence of methane emissions, pinpoints the source of potential leaks, and speeds the response time to repair pipelines.

The "gas sniffer" works by deploying a high-tech analyzer on the rear of a hybrid electric vehicle. As the vehicle drives through city streets, it detects the presence of methane and ethane and passes air samples to a device that records wind speed and directional readings. Ameren Illinois crews use GPS coordinates to pinpoint the location and mobilize response units. The technology is capable of detecting methane gas hundreds of feet away.

NEW STATE ENERGY LAW MEANS CHANGES FOR ILLINOIS CONSUMERS

In September, Governor Pritzker signed a comprehensive energy law that will impact families in Central and Southern Illinois for years to come. During the nearly three-year period that the state has worked on this policy, Ameren Illinois has advocated for a common-sense approach that treats Downstate residents and businesses fairly and keeps energy reliable and affordable. Climate change is a critical issue for our state and nation. As the state's largest Downstate utility that supplies both electric and natural gas services, we support a measured transition to a cleaner energy future.

We're encouraged that the law supports the continued investment in modernizing Illinois' energy infrastructure — the poles, wires, and technology that deliver the reliable energy needed to power homes and businesses. Provisions to increase production of affordable renewable energy in Downstate Illinois. including construction of additional large scale solar, will deliver significant local economic impact, put more clean energy onto the grid, and reduce energy costs for our customers.

The new energy law also includes a multitude of new programs and changes that will raise energy bills and could impact the availability of affordable energy. As provisions in the legislation are implemented, we promise to keep a close eye on them and work closely with state legislators and energy stakeholders to ensure that our customers receive the benefits they will be paying for.

AMEREN RECOGNIZED FOR **DISABILITY INCLUSION**

Once again, Ameren has received a perfect 100% on the Disability Equality Index (DEI), earning recognition as a "Best Place to Work for Disability Inclusion." The honor recognizes programs and policies that promote inclusiveness for Ameren employees, customers and suppliers with disabilities. When temperatures drop, natural gas usage increases as we turn up the heat to stay warm and comfortable. You may have seen news stories about the global increase in the price of natural gas and its expected impact on heating costs. We want you to be aware that, because of the higher cost of natural gas, winter heating bills are estimated to be at least 30% higher than they were last winter (assuming normal temperatures).

We recognize that these may be challenging times for some individuals and families and understand the financial burden that any increases can cause. That's why we want to help you prepare in order to minimize the potential impact:

- Budget Billing allows you to spread your energy costs over a longer period and avoid larger monthly bills. Under the payment plan, your bills are calculated using the average monthly bill amount based on the last 12 months. Enroll in Budget Billing online at AmerenIllinois.com/Budget.
