HELPING HEROES


Ameren Illinois has a long tradition of supporting our nation's military. In late June, we hosted several outreach events to provide information, resources, and energy bill payment grants to disabled veterans.

Customer Service Representatives were on hand at each event to answer questions and accept applications for the Ameren Illinois Military Support Program (AIMS). The AIMS program provides grants up to \$100 to assist with energy costs for qualified military and disabled veterans.

FAQ: POWER SUPPLY PRICES



Inflation, increased demand for energy, insufficient renewable generation and high natural gas prices have led to an energy shortage, causing wholesale power supply prices to spike.

Does Ameren Illinois have any influence on power supply prices?

No. Ameren Illinois does not generate or sell power. Ameren Illinois is strictly an energy delivery company that carries power on our poles and wires to homes and businesses, similar to how FedEx and UPS deliver packages to the doorstep.

The Illinois Power Agency (IPA) procures wholesale electricity for residential and small commercial customers who have not switched to an alternative supplier.

Ameren Illinois purchases power at the price set by the IPA and passes those costs directly through to our customers, dollar for dollar.

What can customers do to manage higher bills?

Reducing energy usage is the best way to lessen the impact of higher supply prices. Ameren Illinois

NEW SCAM TARGETS SENIOR CITIZENS

While scammers have been posing as utility representatives for years, a new twist is targeting senior citizens. Ameren Illinois warns customers to be aware of scammers posing as Ameren representatives offering customers a special discounted rate of \$29.99, which is sometimes called a "senior discount." If you receive a suspected scam call, hang up immediately and call Ameren Illinois at 1.800.755.5000 to report it.

HOW TO SPOT A UTILITY SCAM

- The caller may offer a special discounted rate and ask for immediate payment. The scammer will often suggest payment through cash apps, which Ameren representatives will never do.
- Scammers may also ask for immediate payment by credit card, debit card or a prepaid card to avoid service disconnection.
- Legitimate utility companies do not specify how customers should make a bill payment and always offer a variety of ways to pay a bill. Ameren Illinois customers can make payments online, by phone, electronic check, by mail or at in-person pay locations.


LEARN MORE ABOUT YOUR **HOME'S ENERGY USAGE**

ELECTRICAL SAFETY 101

TEACH STUDENTS ABOUT ELECTRICAL SAFETY BEFORE THEY HEAD TO COLLEGE

Today's college student uses many electronics for school, work and play. If you or a loved one is heading off to college, follow these tips to make sure helpful gadgets don't become electrical hazards:

- If you must use extension cords in your dorm room, use them temporarily and unplug them when not in use.
- Consider purchasing power strips with an over-current protector, which will shut off power automatically if there is too much current being drawn.
- Use light bulbs with the correct wattage for lamps. If no indication is on the fixture, do not use a bulb with more than 60 watts.
- Never tack or nail an electrical cord to any surface or run cords across traffic paths, under rugs or furniture.
- Keep all electrical appliances and cords safely away from bedding, curtains, and other flammable material.
- Do not use an electronic device with a frayed cord or damaged plug.
- If your lights flicker, electronics shut off or circuits trip, notify campus staff.
- Use only laboratory-certified appliances and electronics.
- If an outlet becomes overheated, unplug everything from the outlet and notify the landlord or dorm officials immediately.
